June 7, 1914 - December 19, 2012

Sarah Sally Jewett Cook, age 98 of Bloomington passed away early Wednesday morning December 19, 2012 at Indiana University Health Hospice House. Sally was born June 7, 1914 in Muncie, Indiana to Fred and Larhue Dungan Cook.

She was a graduate of both Western College in Oxford, Ohio and Indiana University and continued her service at both schools as a trustee of the Alumnae Association at Western College and as a member of the Alumni Board for Indiana University.

Sally was the co fonder of Opportunity House in Bloomington along with Hazel Smith and Betty Applegate; was a choir member and longtime member of First United Church; belonged to Kappa Alpha Theta social sorority; Tri Kappa; 19th Century Club; and Wednesday Club. Sally was honored as volunteer of the year by President Bush's 1000 Points of Light initiative and was recognized more recently by the Area 10 Agency on Aging receiving their Senior Salute Award.

Sally is survived by her son Robert R. Cook of Mexico; granddaughters Calista and Salina Cook; nieces Jane Vanderburg, Susan Murray and Nancy O'Brasky, and a nephew Maurice O'Rourk. Sally was preceded in death by her parents, her husband of 67 years Robert A. Cook, brother George Jewett, sister Martha O'Rourk, and brother and sister in law Fred and Beryl Cook.

Funeral services for Sally will be Friday December 21, 2012 at 2:00PM at Allen Funeral Home 4155 South Old Highway 37. Reverend Dr. Jack Skiles will preside. Sally will be laid to rest next to her husband at Valhalla Memory Gardens.
