Steve Howard died peacefully at his home in Bloomington following a brief illness, with his family at his side.

Born and raised in Santa Cruz, California, he joined the Navy in 1958, where he served for thirty-seven years. His career took him to various locations on both US coasts, and overseas with his family to the Philippines and Japan. During that time, he earned bachelor's and master's degrees in electrical engineering from Purdue University. He ended his Navy career in 1994 as commander of the Crane Naval Surface Warfare base.

Upon his retirement from the Navy, he became the CEO of the Greater Bloomington Chamber of Commerce, where he brought a fresh approach to advocacy for the business community. Having moved around frequently with the Navy, Steve especially valued putting down roots in the Bloomington community and having the opportunity to volunteer with several local organizations. During his tenure at the Chamber, he earned a master's in public administration from Indiana University. He retired in 2005.

Steve met and married his wife Nancy in 1961. Together they raised three children, Missy Seu, Jason and Mark Howard. Following Nancy's death in 1999, he married Cassie Brooks in 2001. Upon his retirement from the Chamber, Steve and Cassie spent four years on a sailboat in Mexico, realizing one of his long-held aspirations. An avid outdoors enthusiast, he especially

enjoyed hiking in the California mountains.

Steve is survived by his wife and children, his stepsons Aaron and Bryan Brooks, and eight grandchildren. He was a principled, straightforward man, with a larger-than-life personality, and he had a lasting impact on his family, friends, and colleagues.
