Timothy George Keough, age 57 of Bloomington, passed away early Thursday morning, March 27, 2014 at Indiana University Health Bloomington Hospital. He was born in Bloomington on May 16, 1956 to John A. and Martha L. Lanam Keough.

Tim went to grade school at St. Charles Borromeo Catholic Church School where he proudly served as an alter boy; graduated from Bloomington High School highlighted by hard work, sweat and success he enjoyed as a member of the 1973 Panther Football squad that competed in the first Indiana State Football Championship series.

Ultimately He received his associates degree from ITT Technical Institute in electrical engineering.

He spent his professional career as an electrical engineer working firstly for Texas Instruments in Dallas, Texas for five years and then subsequently Emerson Network Power Services for twenty five plus years.

Tim had wide and varied interests in life. He was an avid music lover and tambourine player; coached both his children's' baseball and softball teams; and will always be remembered for the way he made people laugh, his own brand of humor and outlook on life. Most importantly though, in his children's eyes, their dad was, " the best friend you could want to have, but still a dad."

He is survived by his daughter Kristin L. Keough of Bloomington; son Sean A. Keough and wife Dawn of Bloomington; grandchildren Jordan A. Meeks, and Taylor A. Keough; brothers Daniel B. Keough of Dallas, Texas, John T. Keough and wife Susan of Minneapolis, Minnesota, Kevin R. Keough and wife Trudy of Bloomington. He is also survived by his close companion and family friend, Brenda Stauch of Bloomington.

Tim was preceded in death by his parents, his sister in law Ann Keough and brother Robert Keough, whom passed away in November of 2013.
