Virginia Shirley Reineking, age 94 of Franklin formerly of Bloomington, passed away Tuesday morning November 27, 2012 at the Masonic Home. Virginia was born September 7, 1918 in Putnam County to Vernon and Laura Alice Cooper Shirley.
