Warren "Gene" Eugene Robertson, age 92, passed away peacefully at his home on Tuesday, September 8th. Born March 22nd, 1923, in Bloomington, he was the son of Rufus and Nora (Goodman) Robertson.

Gene was a loving and caring husband, father, grandfather, and great-grandfather. He enlisted in the US Coast Guard in 1942, and served as a fireman during WW II. Gene was a master plumber, and a 67 year member of the Plumber's and Steamfitter's Union Local 136. As an avid IU Sports fan, one of his proudest achievements was serving as the plumbing superintendent during the construction of IU's Memorial Stadium, where he never missed a home game for nearly 50 years. Some of Gene's hobbies included fishing, hunting, photography, gardening and cooking. He also enjoyed stained glass artwork, Nascar, and bluegrass music. He was a member of the Clear Creek Christian Church for many years.

Gene is survived by his wife of 70 years, Mary Katherine "Kate" (Williams) Robertson. Their life together was a beautiful love story. He is also survived by his sister, Phyllis (Gordon) Brinegar; son, Ernie (Marilyn) Robertson; daughter, Teresa Meyer; son-in-law, John Scott; grandchildren: Andy (Lisa) Scott, Jennifer
