Wesley H. Jehs of Bloomington passed away at his residence late Tuesday evening the 16th of February 2010. He was 90. Wesley was born July 20, 1919 in Chicago, Illinois to William and Josephine Gorr Jehs. He graduated from high school in the Chicago area and then attended Northwestern University in Evanston, Illinois for 2 years. He went on to proudly serve his country in the United States Navy in the Pacific Theatre during World War II.
